### GOAL OF THE PROJECT

To organize collections containing images and information on energy resources in Texas, to digitize these materials, to create metadata records for these materials, and to make them accessible online for researchers.

# CONFEDERATE REUNION GROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

The Confederate Reunion Grounds will focus primarily on an oral history project beginning with the 1920s for aging individuals who lived on the grounds during the Mexia Oil Boom and employed by the Pure Oil Company.

# CONFEDERATE REUNION GROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

Additional oral histories may include family members and employees of Brown Oil Company (purchased Pure Oil Company and the leased water rights at the CRG).

# CONFEDERATE REUNION GROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

Supporting materials held within private collections related to the site's history will be digitized – to include family photographs and documents, Pure Oil Company and Brown Oil Company documents, and other related materials not accessible to the public.

# CONFEDERATE REUNION GROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

Other State held-in-trust collections for the Confederate Reunion Grounds may include 1920s maps from the Pure Oil Company and associated collections for the Reunion Movement that are interwoven with the Mexia Oil Boom.

# CONFEDERATE REUNION GROUNDS STATE HISTORIC SITE

Partner with local libraries and archives to process associated collections and funding for digitization to make collections available for public access.





# THE SOUTHWEST COLLECTION/SPECIAL COLLECTIONS LIBRARY

The Southwest Collection seeks to digitize, abstract and catalog two large manuscript collections and their related oral histories and photographs. The first collection, the Locating Board, deals with the early 1920s competition between numerous West Texas communities vying for the new college that later became Texas Technological College.

# THE SOUTHWEST COLLECTION/SPECIAL COLLECTIONS LIBRARY

The 34 unpublished proposals within this collection details each bidder's geographic, agricultural and natural resources, as well as addressing the topics of population, infrastructure and transportation. They also contain photographs, numerous maps, some of which are hand colored, and detailed narratives on the early history of the each community.



# THE SOUTHWEST COLLECTION/SPECIAL COLLECTIONS LIBRARY

The second collection concerns the Crosbyton Solar Power Project, which received national prominence in the 1980s for its attempts to find an alternative energy source as a way to reduce rising local utility rates. Among its manuscript collection are photographs, solar dish and mirror blueprints and drawings, and numerous technical reports. Oral histories for both collections will be abstracted and cataloged.




